## Mayor's Welcome

Becoming Mayor of Stratford-upon-Avon is not about the person, it's all about the office. Much of the role is ceremonial, however, being elected to the office affords the Mayor an opportunity to make a difference in our town.

I have always been interested in food and the benefits of good nutrition. It's something we need every day and yet access to and affordability of good, nutritious food remains a critical issue for many in our town. While solutions are complex, as Mayor I want to play my part.

I am extremely fortunate that the new Deputy Mayor, Councillor Letty Petrovic, shares this interest in food and nutrition. So, together we have a two-year opportunity to embark on our important social mission.

In July I shall be hosting the first of a monthly soup lunch to be held in the Town Hall. A lunch open to all. Letty and I also aim to launch an initiative we are provisionally calling 5Meals4Life, involving a nutritionist, food and community groups working together to help deliver greater knowledge about eating well. Together with other stakeholders such as Stratford Town Trust, I shall campaign for the introduction of a Community Fridge, providing a much-needed supply of fresh goods to those most in need within our town.

A further goal as Mayor is to encourage wider collaboration and inclusivity – across all sectors, ages and communities. My experience as Deputy Mayor taught me how much of a difference positive engagement can make to improving people's lives. So, I would like the Town Hall itself to become an even more welcoming and inclusive space. I shall be inviting many of those unrecognised but invaluable members of our community to join me in the Town Hall – not just to acknowledge their contribution but also to learn from these groups what more we can do to improve the quality of life here in Stratford.

The ever-cheerful BIFFA street cleaning team have already accepted my invitation for tea and cake in the Mayor's parlour. I look forward to welcoming many other groups, as well as our younger citizens, all of whom deserve our support and encouragement.

## Deputy Mayor's Welcome

I am passionate about tackling social inequalities and strengthening community cohesion. Over the past three years I have worked with a range of community groups and charities focused on improving access to sustainable, nutritious and affordable food whilst tackling food waste.

I volunteer at the Ken Kennett Community Kitchen with Net Zero Stratford and have previously supported Stratford Foodbank at the Fred Winter Centre. I am also a board member of Warwickshire Community and Voluntary Action's (CAVA) Community Builder Project, which connects and supports the communities of Clopton and Bishopton to help reduce social exclusion.

Alongside my civic role, I work with the national charity The Food Foundation, which campaigns for everyone to have access to healthy and affordable food. In my role as Deputy Mayor and working alongside the Mayor, I am looking forward to supporting initiatives across Stratford-upon-Avon that bring people together through food and shared experiences. I am particularly interested in promoting social dining and community-led food initiatives that create welcoming spaces for residents to connect, participate and enjoy good, nutritious food together.

This work also links to wider challenges facing the town and district, including rising childhood obesity and the increasing reliance on food banks. I hope to support community initiatives that showcase new models for improving access to healthy food while strengthening connections across Stratford.

## New Council Committee Structure

The Council has been reviewing its current decision-making structure to ensure it remains efficient and focused on the areas where the Council adds the greatest value to the community.

Under the proposed arrangements, Full Council would continue to meet six times per year, in addition to the Annual Council Meeting. Full Council would retain

responsibility for major policy decisions, statutory obligations, budget setting, the Code of Conduct, while also receiving reports and recommendations from committees.

A new Governance, Finance and Resources Committee will oversee all financial matters, including grants, new projects, HR policies and staffing matters, with formal HR processes remaining in line with Council procedures.

Meanwhile, the proposed Community Wellbeing and Place Committee will focus on the Council's key operational services, including the cemetery, allotments and open spaces, the Town Hall, markets, events and wider community activity.

Planning, Environment and Transport, will continue to meet on a three-weekly basis to consider planning applications and submit the Council's comments.

Overall, the proposed changes are intended to simplify governance arrangements, improve efficiency and ensure that both Member and officer time is focused on strategic priorities and effective community delivery.

## Choosing the right service

| <b>GP/Doctor</b>           | Persistent symptoms<br>Long term conditions<br>Chronic pain<br>New prescriptions | Make an <b>appointment with your GP</b> if you are feeling unwell and it is not an emergency.   |
| <b>Pharmacist</b>          | Minor illnesses<br>Headaches<br>Stomach upset<br>Bites & stings                  | Ask your <b>local Pharmacist for advice</b> – your pharmacist can give you advice for many common minor illnesses.  |
| <b>NHS 111</b>             | Unsure?<br>Unwell?<br>Confused?<br>Need help?                                    | Call <b>NHS 111</b> if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation. You can also call NHS 111 if you're not sure which NHS service you need.     |
| <b>Self Care</b>           | Coughs & colds<br>Grazed knees<br>Sore throats<br>Other minor issues             | A lot of illnesses can be treated in your home by using over the counter medicine and getting plenty of rest.   |
